The search for the city's next Director of Public Works has ended with the selection of Christine Guelker. Guelker was most recently the Assistant City Manager/Director of Operations in Colorado City, Texas.

Hose-end sprinklers are allowed ONLY before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. on your assigned days!

#### Ok every day:

- Drip irrigation, soaker hose, handheld hose and tree bubblers, but only for two hours at a time
- Hand-held buckets and hoses with shut off valves for washing vehicles

#### Please don't:

- Hose paved areas or buildings, unless it's for fire protection
- Establish new turf without a variance from the city

These rules are in place year-round. Should further conservation be required, you will receive a notification from the city as to those measures.
